#### The Foundation: Routine Care

Consistent, gentle care is the secret to protecting your Rosewood's exquisite surface.

- **Dusting:** Dust regularly with a soft, lint-free cloth (like microfiber). Always wipe gently in the direction of the grain to avoid micro-scratches.
- **Cleaning Spills:** Act immediately. Blot spills with a clean, absorbent cloth. Do not wipe. For sticky residue, use a cloth slightly dampened with water, then immediately wipe the area dry with a separate clean cloth.

#### Enhancing the Deep Lustre: Polishing

To maintain Rosewood's signature deep, almost three-dimensional glow, occasional polishing is key.

- **Less is More:** Polishing every few months is more than sufficient. Over-polishing can lead to buildup.
- **Choose the Right Product:** Use a high-quality, wax-based furniture polish. Paste wax is often preferred by experts for Rosewood as it provides a hard, protective film that enhances its natural depth. Avoid all-purpose sprays or products with silicone.
- **Application:** Apply a very small amount of polish to a clean, soft cloth and work it into the wood in the direction of the grain using a circular or oval motion. Let it sit for a few minutes, then buff gently with a second clean cloth to a brilliant sheen.

#### Critical Mistakes to Avoid with Fine Exotic Woods

- **Never Use Excessive Water:** Water can damage the delicate finish and penetrate the wood.
- **Avoid Direct Sunlight:** Rosewood's rich color is photosensitive. Prolonged exposure to direct sunlight will cause it to fade and lighten over time.

- **Protect from Scratches and Heat:** Always use coasters, placemats, and felt pads under any objects placed on the surface to prevent damage.
